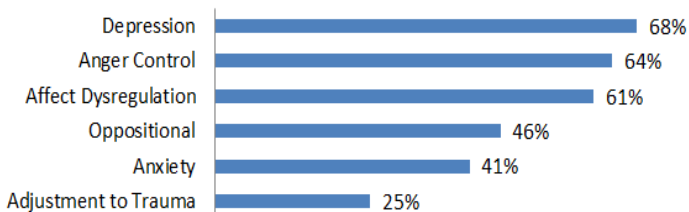


Children's Intensive Services (CIS)

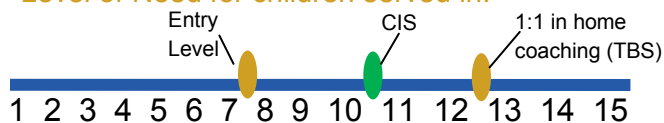
Behavioral and Emotional Needs at intake:

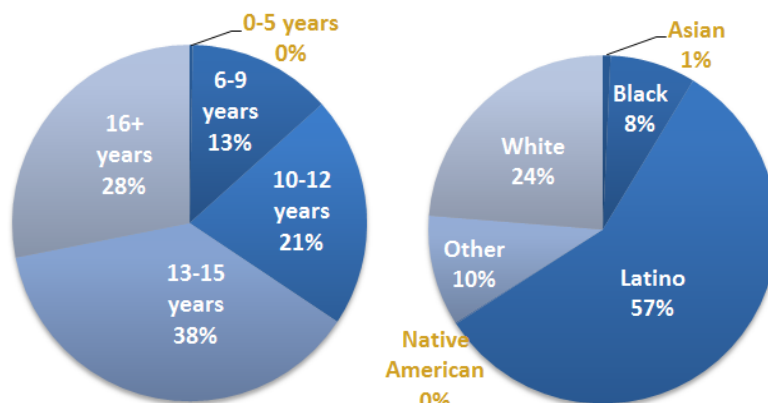


Who We See:

CIS is an intensive home-based program targeting Medi-Cal beneficiaries with high levels of need. Children and youth with a psychiatric hospitalization are referred to CIS.

Everyone seen through CIS has some type of behavioral/emotional need that is negatively impacting their ability to function in some manner. Most frequent issues are listed.

Adding the number of issues for which help is needed allows us to gauge how intensive of a program is needed.



What We Do:

CIS provides specialty mental health services tailored to the specific needs of the child and family. These include therapy, targeted case management, rehabilitative services, and collaterals.

CIS provides services 2 to 4 times per week, which is more than twice as often as our entry level programs.

How We Help:

The Reliable Change Index (RCI) is a statistical test used to assess the global impact of services. The percentages listed are the percentage of children who showed improvement at the end of services.

Treatment research indicates that improvement levels significantly above 33% indicate an effective clinical program.

In evaluating the impact on specific needs, only children needing help with an issue are considered. For example, 72% of the children needing help adjusting to a trauma showed improvement by the end of services.
